LEARNING CORNER

Badgers

We have begun our new class novel – 'Orphans of the Tide' by Struan Murray. We have used our inference skills to work out what the main character, Hargarth, is like – he does not seem to be someone you would want to be friends with!

In geography, we have been learning about the difference between the UK, Great Britain & the British Isles as well as identifying some key physical features in each country of the UK.

Mrs Godfrey's maths group have been comparing units of measure – converting between mm, cm and m is a bit tricky – maybe you could practise at home eg order from shortest to longest:

13mm 1cm 4mm 1m 25cm 120cm

Foxes

This week, Foxes have started their new geography unit all about climate. They have revised the seven continents and five oceans of the world before learning about the three different climate zones: tropical, temperate and polar. The children shaded a world map using three colours to represent each zone. Ask them what the climate zones are.

In English, we have started reading a new book called 'Hunter's Icy Adventure'. This book is going to help us with our writing over the next few weeks. Hunter is a polar bear who gets caught out in the warming temperatures but rescued by a team of people. This week, Foxes have been describing Hunter's character, his personality and appearance.

During our maths lessons, we have been revising methods for adding and subtracting. Year 3 have been using a formal column method while Year 2 have been partitioning two digit numbers to add and subtract. Foxes then applied these methods within word problems.

Otters

We have enjoyed the warmer weather this week and have made the most of our outside area. In phonics, EYFS have learned to read and write ure and er in words. Year 1 investigated different ways of spelling the igh phoneme. In maths, year 1 revisited number bonds for all numbers up to 10 and then used these facts to derive the corresponding subtractions. We are working hard to remember all the bonds up to 10 by heart. The EYFS children continued to learn to count, order and write number up to 20. Some are also able to accurately estimate. In PSHE, we discussed the rights and responsibilities we have within the class. We also thought about our responsibilities as a family member and which jobs we could do around our homes to help our families.
