
Next week, Y3 – Y6 will have a visit from Wiltshire Air Ambulance for some Emergency Awareness training. This will include:-

Learning Corner

Badgers:

Miss Graham's math group - This term, we are learning all about decimals. Last week, we were beginning to learn about decimal equivalents to fractions and this week we have been taking lots of termly assessments. Back onto decimals next week though so, get ready to use your perseverance and resilience skills. We can do it! In Jig-Saw (PSHE) we have considered roles within friendship groups — is there a leader? Is there a follower? Talk to your child about how they see themselves.

In English, we have continued to work on persuasive writing. Next week, we will begin to write our 'pitch letters' for the engineer competition. The children need to be able to write at least 3 reasons why their design should be made and each reason needs to be in detail. This will be a challenge, so once again, please help your child prepare for this writing. Thank you.

Foxes:

Mrs Stevens has been off ill for some of this week. In her absence, Foxes have continued with their assessments in reading, writing and maths. In PE, they have taken part in circuits to improve their strength and overall fitness.

Otters:

Miss Graham – In Otters, this term we have been learning about the characters in traditional tales. So far, we have learned about the 'baddies' in the stories of Jack and the Beanstalk and The Three Little Pigs. We have been using role play to develop our understanding of why the baddies did what they did. EYFS children have been retelling the stories by using masks and finger puppets. They have acted out their plays to the rest of the class and they have been extremely good and funny!

In maths, we have been finishing our learning about longer periods of time – months and seasons - and we are beginning to learn about money. The children have been role playing shops, recognising and ordering coins (in terms of their values) and using money to count in 1ps, 2ps, 5ps and 10ps. Please give your children opportunities to pay for items with money when they are shopping with you. So many children only get to see their parents using phones and cards now whilst shopping.

In PE, we are learning how catch, throw and roll accurately. In computing, we are learning about technology in the home and in school and the year 1s are learning how to use Scratch Junior.
