Learning Corner

Badgers:

In maths, Y5 have been consolidating their understanding of how to find missing angles in 2 D shapes, on a line and at a point. Additionally, they have been finding the area and perimeter of rectangular shapes and have been learning how to calculate missing values. Y6 have continued to revise all areas of maths and apply their understanding to reasoning problems.

In science, we have been thinking about what make a healthy lifestyle in terms of diet and exercise.

Badgers have also been painting their mod roc mythical creatures. They will be on display next term in our library so do come and have a look. Year 5 have been solving multiplication and division word problems in maths. In English, we have edited and top copied our Greek myths ready to go on display.

Foxes:

This week in Foxes we have been writing and producing our Stone Age information books. In maths, we have been recapping money. We have been finding totals of amounts and finding change. Following our exciting trip to Stonehenge the children have been designing and making their own mini Stonehenge out of clay.

Otters:

This week Otters have written non-fiction books about Owls. They will be on display in the corridor outside Otters classroom. In maths we have been busy working on our individual maths passport targets. We also investigated using subtraction, addition and equals signs to make both sides of a number sentence balance. As we approach Easter we investigated Easter traditions and made a floral cross in RE. On Tuesday we dodged the showers and hailstones to search for signs of spring around the village.
