Learning Corner

Badgers:

The main focus in Badgers has been our Vision Vessel. In maths, Y5 have been learning about perimeter and area, how these are measured and how to calculate or count values. They will be going on to investigate volume next.

We have learned four chords in ukulele lessons and Mrs Bourne is extremely proud of the whole class who are now sounding rather good.

Foxes:

This week across the school, we have been learning about our vision vessel and learning how all the different parts represent our school. Foxes class really enjoyed joining Badgers to interview Mrs Burnard and Mrs Bligden to find out exactly what their roles are. We have also made our own rockets to represent the school by using junk modelling.

In English and RE we have been thinking about our value of creativity and have been learning the Hindu story of creation. We have acted out the story, and retold it within our writing. We also thought about the similarities and differences between the Hindu and Christian creation stories.

Otters:

This week, Otters have been writing books about a world trip. The year 1s used capital letters for days of the week and names of places. In maths, Year 1s added and subtracted 2 and 1 digit numbers deciding on the operation themselves. EYFS have been working on individual maths targets based on their maths passports. In the afternoons, we discussed parts of our vision vessel, thinking about where we want the rocket to take us in our learning and who would man the rocket to help us with our learning. We all made split pin astronauts and labelled rocket ships.
