LEARNING CORNER

Badgers:

In RE, our key question this term has been 'What would Jesus do?' This week, we focused on Jesus' message of forgiveness and how he taught this in many ways, including through the parable of the Prodigal Son. We discussed how important it is to forgive and why this is one of our core values.

We continue to do weekly spellings - our lesson and test are now on a Friday. There are lot of ways that you can help to practise spellings, including through using Spelling Frame. Ask your child how to play noughts and crosses - the spelling version.

In science, we continued to learn about air resistance and its effect on falling objects. Last week we dropped two plastic tubs the same size and shape from the climbing frame - one empty, the other filled with stones. This week we dropped two pieces of paper from the same height, one crumpled, the other flat.

Foxes:

On Wednesday this week, Foxes spent the afternoon with Mr Widger from Kingdown school to start a mini sports leaders programme. This programme will take around 5 – 6 hours and will enable the children to build their own leadership skills. The course is a mini version of the conference that our year 5/6 sports ambassadors do each September.

Also this week, Foxes have been writing our own version of the story 'Ug, Boy Genius of the Stone Age'. The children have been working hard on writing quality sentences including strong vocabulary and a range of conjunctions. Year 3 have even worked hard to include correctly punctuated speech.

During maths, the year 3s have been link multiplication and division with finding fractions of amounts while year 2 have been understanding that to find halves and quarters we divide something in 2 or 4 equal groups.

Otters:

This week in Otters, we began to re-tell the story of Jack and the Jellybean stalk. We watched a video of some very cute cows. This helped us say and write sentences about how devastated Jack felt when he had to sell Daisy the cow. Then we generated a word bank to describe the taste and look of the sweets in the sweet shop. We will use this vocabulary in our retelling/writing next week. In Maths, EYFS children enjoyed identifying coins in the fruit cafe and memory game. The year 1 children, learned to place numbers on number lines using the vocabulary more and less. In geography we compared places in the Amazon rain forest to places we know in the United Kingdom and Wiltshire.

Otters "Dress to express" day is on Wednesday 31st of March.

As part of our Mental Wellbeing (PSHE) this term, we have been talking about self-expression. On Wednesday 31st March, our lesson is called: 'Dress to express.' We would like Otters' class to choose their own clothes to wear, rather than school uniform. They could wear their favourite clothes or clothes that make them feel happy or relaxed. or clothes that tell us something about them. This isn't a 'mufti day' so you don't need to bring any money in.
