Learning Corner

Badgers:

This week, the year 4s have been working together with the year 5s. They have been finding the area and perimeters of various shapes and revising formal methods used to add, subtract, multiply and divide. They have been working out various fraction and negative number problems that were given in Roman numerals. The Year 4s will be revisiting statistics on Monday and will be assessed on this terms statistics learning next Tuesday

Foxes:

This week in Foxes, Year 2 have completed their SATs paper - they should be very proud of themselves. In English, we have been writing a recount of our trip to Stonehenge while in maths we have been recapping shapes. Year 3 have been learning about different types of lines and how they can make angles. Foxes class have also been learning how to use our new laptops. It was very exciting!

Otters:

This week, Year 1 have been learning that English words hardly ever end with the letter v, so if a word ends with a /v/ sound, the letter e usually needs to be added after the 'v'. They also wrote postcards from Antarctica. EYFS children enjoyed learning outside and recording the objects they could see. In maths, we investigated the sequences made by adding a 2-digit and a 1-digit number. We also began to subtract a 1 digit number from a 2-digit number using our subtraction facts. In Maths, the EYFS have been using grouping into 10s and 5s to help them count larger numbers of objects In geography, we were all learning to name the main oceans and year 1 labelled their play dough maps of the world.
