# **Learning Corner**

## **Badgers:**

We began to work on non-chronological reports in our English this week. Ask your child if they can recall the features of this genre. We also been learning about prefixes and suffixes - how they help us work out the meaning of new vocabulary as well as spelling rules linked to adding suffixes to root words. In geography, we have begun to learn about the greenhouse effect and how it affects our climate.

## Foxes:

This week in Foxes, we have been planning our own stories based in Narnia. The children have thought about how they might meet under the lamp post if they went through the wardrobe and what would happen to them. Ask them about their stories.

In maths, year 3 have been learning how to use column subtraction while year 2 have been understanding the commutative law and then using this to help them solve missing number problems.

In science, we carried out a scientific enquiry to compare how objects move on different surfaces and thought about how the force of friction changes depending on the surface.

## Otters:

This week, Year 1 completed their Bonfire Night fact file. EYFS have been learning to read and write f, ff, l, ll in words. In maths, the EYFS were finding the total of 2 groups of object either by counting all of the objects or counting on with support. The Year 1 children have found number bonds up to 10 and are working hard to learn them by heart. In science, we have begun to name parts of the human body.
