

LEARNING CORNER

Badgers:

In science, we learned about adaptation this week. We played the 'blob' game which was a fun way of getting to understand how different species will become extinct as their environment changes - ask your child if they were a swimmer, a runner or a flyer and what happened to them.

In RE, we revised the story of Pentecost and then read texts written by the apostles. We learned that some of these texts were letters giving advice and teaching whilst some were recording history. Luke wrote history in Acts, Paul wrote advice (letters) in Corinthians and Galatians.

In maths, we continue to work on geometry. In Y6, children are plotting points across all four quadrants, finding unknown co-ordinates using their knowledge of 2D shapes. In Y5/6 children are carrying out reasoning and problem-solving activities using their knowledge of 2 and 3D shapes to find unknown quantities or to determine 'sometimes, always, never rules.

Foxes:

The children welcomed Miss Ballinger into Foxes class.

This week in English, Foxes have been learning how, and starting to write, a recount of their trip to Stonehenge. In Maths, they have been getting to grips with money and finding change, by choosing strategies such as finding the difference on a number line and column subtraction. In science, we have been investigating how much liquid a nappy can hold using a fair test – we shall the results to Mrs Stevens as she needs to know all about nappies!

Otters:

This week Year 1 children completed their Maths and Writing assessments. I have enjoyed reading their own versions of the Selfish Crocodile. In the afternoons we continued our animal art. Firstly we looked closely at patterns painted on elephants and used these to inspire our own ideas. Then we studied aboriginal art and created patterns on animal templates. In PSHE this week we talked about moving on to our new year groups.
