#### Dear Parents,

We have had another busy week at school this week. The children have been working hard and I have been really impressed as I am starting to see some improvement in the level of independence and resilience of the children in the way that they are approaching their learning.

We are in the final run up to Christmas now and we have a full week ahead. On Wednesday at 6pm we will be having our Christingle service via Microsoft Teams. At the start of the week your child needs to bring in an orange to make their Christingles. If you have not already done so please check that you are able to log on to your child's team account and contact the school office on Monday or Tuesday if you are having difficulties.

On Thursday we are having our school Christmas dinner. Children are welcome to wear there Christmas jumper instead of their school jumper on this day. On Friday we will be having our class parties and discos. Children can wear there disco clothes on this day. Also on Friday we will be having a special visitor to the school, as the children were not able to see this jolly man at the Christmas fair he will be coming in on Friday. #### OFSTED Feedback:

"Older pupils are not practicing reading comprehension enough."

One of our successes this term has been our approach to whole school reading. The phonics and reading scheme 'Little Wandle' is now in place in EYFS and Y1 and our whole class reading groups are in place from Y2-Y6. This means that children from Y2 onwards are practicing their reading comprehension every day. In these sessions the children look at a range of the following skills: Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explanation, Retrieval and Summary. As we move into next term we will begin to work on reading for pleasure.

We are hoping to start the new term with all of our staff and children healthy and well. In light of the recent news of the increased transmissibility of the Omicron variant of Covid-19, please do not send your son/daughter back to school on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> January, if they have any of the following symptoms:

- A high temperature
- A loss, or change to sense of taste and/or smell
- A new, continuous cough

If they do have these symptoms or are generally feeling under the weather, please book a PCR test for your son/daughter. If possible, please do this before the start of term.
