Dear Parents and Carers,

What a busy week we have had at school this week. Badgers class have started learning about Shackleton and his journey to the south pole. Otters have had a busy week doing lots of different things including looking at the properties of different materials. Foxes have finished their week with a dry yet muddy forest school session.

Our Christian value of the term this week is Wisdom. We will be talking to the children about how they can show Wisdom both in their learning and in their friendships. We have started off by looking at the story 'The Most Magnificent Thing' by Ashley Spires. This story encourages children to show a growth mindset. A growth mindset is the underlying belief that abilities can be developed through effort and practice. Children with a growth mindset persist in the face of challenges because they understand that effort and hard work can change ability and intelligence. I would like to ask you as parents to start to look at this at home as well as at school. As we work together to really affirm that anyone is capable of anything and we are not limited by our ability and intelligence because we can put in hard work and effort to change them.

Kai – for showing wisdom, by creating a fact file at home, on Captain Scott.


Matilda - For showing excellent listening skills in maths and being able to recall methods that have been taught in previous lessons.
