Dear Parents and Carers,

We have a fabulous week ahead of us as we have arrived at sports week. The children will be experiencing a wide range of sports that we do not normally offer in our school curriculum including climbing on a climbing wall and Ultimate Frisbee. In this newsletter I am continuing to give an overview of some of the elements shared in the parents workshop from a few weeks ago. This week I am going to speak about mindfulness and resilience.

As I have said before I want to see all of us working as a team, that includes children, teachers and parents. We all need to be mindful of ourselves and others. How we act and behave has a huge impact on those around us. We need to teach children to understand how their actions and choices impact people around them. Two of our school rules link to this:

- Focus on your learning - Manage your distractions.

These are geared toward our expectations that children are mindful of those around them and that they do not let their actions impact on the learning of others but they also do not let the actions of others impact on their own learning. We need to teach them to be secure in who they are and to be less concerned with what other people might think of them.

Resilience is a crucial element of learning. Everyone has experienced being knocked down. Children need to be able to get back up. I have previously mentioned that learning is hard. Children are not always going to find things easy in school or indeed in life. We need to support them to develop their resilience to keep on going even when it is hard. Do not say 'I can't' say 'I can't do it yet'.

My aim for the school is to ensure that these three areas are developed for all of the children. Allowing them to meet challenges and overcome them.

I also want to remind you that during this term we will be teaching the children the Sex and Relationships elements of the national curriculum. If you have any questions or would like to see the material that we share with the children or would like further information please do speak to myself or your child's class teacher.
